Growing Through the Motions

You might think of “going through the motions” as a negative thing—like when someone is just phoning it in, not engaged, on cruise control, and not really putting their heart into something. But here’s the catch: doing the same thing over and over until it becomes a habit is only a problem if you’re doing the wrong thing repeatedly.

God wants to change your life, and believe it or not, He wants to do it by having you go through—and grow through—the motions. When there is a repeated practice of prayer, a repeated practice of tithing, worship, gathering, and getting into God’s word, transformation happens.

If you can get the right things baked into your muscle memory, the right things on autopilot, you will see God change you, shape you, mold you, and do incredible things through you.

As you lean into these motions, these life-changing spiritual practices, we’re going to take a closer look at prayer, one of the powerful ways God invites you into a deeper relationship with Him.

What Prayer Is Not

When Jesus is teaching his disciples in Matthew 6 how to pray, interestingly enough, He starts by teaching them how not to pray (Matthew 6:5). It's kind of like if your dad was going to teach you how to use a Skilsaw, he would probably begin with some sort of dad spiel like, "Now listen up. First things first—never put your hands anywhere near the blade." He's going to teach you what not to do because that's the thing that can most damage you. And the same is true of prayer.

PRAYER IS NOT A PERFORMANCE

Don't pray to be seen by people or for attention or accolades that might come from it. He says that your prayers should not be offered up to make yourself appear spiritual before others. It's an interesting tension because praying out loud with others can be so difficult and embarrassing. What do I say? How do I pray with people listening? The motive is to pray to our Father in Heaven together. Adoring. Agreeing. Asking. Not to be noticed by people but to engage with our God.

Jesus said that the most important prayer time is when you shut the door and pray with Him alone. He calls it the secret place, and there's beauty in private prayer.

PRAYER IS NOT "EFFICIENT"

Prayer is beautifully inefficient. Think about it: when you get on your knees to pray, wake up early for those quiet moments, or crack open a journal to talk to God, you know what you're not doing? Anything else—especially all the demands of the day and the things competing for your attention.

But setting aside that time and space to seek God gives you the strength you need to handle everything you'll face that day. You become a higher capacity, more patient, more like Jesus, better version of yourself than the un-prayed you who would've rushed into the day.

PRAYER IS NOT ABOUT EARNING GOD'S FAVOR

Prayer isn't a way to "earn" spiritual points or show off your holiness. One of the most dangerous ways to misuse prayer is through pride—using it as a tool for self-promotion rather than as a way to commune with God. It's meant to be a humbling experience, granting you access to God's presence and spiritual power. You have favor and access to communicate with God through Jesus—not because you've said the right things, done the right things, or prayed with just the right amount of "thee's," "thou's," and "thine's."

If you're living and serving and praying to please people, then that is all you will ever get, but if your motivation is right and is only to be seen by God, the One who is always with you and already loves you, then you get to walk in the reward only Heaven can give.

What Prayer Is

PRAYER IS A SOURCE OF FORMATION

As you spend time with God, recognizing that He is the potter and you are the clay, you experience formation. He is shaping you. The book of Philippians says that He who began a good work in you will be faithful to complete it (Philippians 1:6).

Your Father seeks your formation. He wants you to grow and change. He does this through time and pressure, and time under pressure brings about transformation.

You can't just go to church once and expect to be completely different. You can't just open your Bible one time and expect every situation to change suddenly. You can't spend time in prayer occasionally or go to one marriage conference and expect all your problems to disappear.

It takes week after week, day after day, dollar after dollar. It's in the spiritual practices of tithing, praying, worshipping together, being in small groups, and doing life with the right people that change happens. Slowly but surely, you'll see your life transformed, formed, and adapted. You'll see God changing your life in the way only a potter can. That's the power of prayer. That's the power of regularly spending time with God.

PRAYER IS A SOURCE OF PERMISSION

In Joshua, we are told that wherever you set the sole of your foot, God will prosper you (Joshua 1:3). As you spend time with Jesus in prayer, you'll find Him placing a permission slip in your hands to go and do all that He has called you to do that day.

What opportunities are right in front of you? What opportunities are you missing? Don't let a day go by without first readying your heart, allowing Him to put that permission slip in your backpack so you can step out with confidence, saying, "Here I am today, ready and called by my God."

PRAYER IS A SOURCE OF VALIDATION

The dictionary defines “validation” as recognition or affirmation that you have worth or are worthwhile. If you don’t receive this from God in the secret place, you’ll constantly seek it from other people.

If you don’t understand that you are made by God, loved by Him, and that He chose you, calls you, and equips you, then you’ll look for validation in anything and anyone else.

Consider this: the only One in the entire universe whose opinion truly matters is delighted with you. And when you spend time with God in secret, you walk out into the world armed with that truth.

PRAYER IS A FIRST LINE OF DEFENSE

Adoniram Judson (A.J.) Gordon, a 19th-century American preacher, writer, and missionary, said, “You can do more than pray after you have prayed, but you cannot do more than pray until you have prayed.” Prayer should be the first thing you do—your first line of defense, not your last resort. You fast, pray, and seek God to keep Him paramount.

Dedicate, Concentrate, and Stay Fascinated with God

Prayer is often approached with a sense of obligation or guilt, as if it’s something that should be done more often or more perfectly. However, Jesus invites you to shift your perspective and see prayer for what it truly is—a powerful, freeing, holy practice—a direct line of communication to Heaven. Instead of walking in condemnation, you

can walk in the power of true prayer, allowing it to be the source of strength, transformation, and communication with the Savior of your soul. This journey is not about adding more pressure to your life. A life of prayer is not about checking a box; it's about encountering your Savior and embracing a real connection with Him.

As you walk forward in your prayer life, remember these guiding principles:

- | Dedicate time each day to private prayer.
- | Concentrate on God, making Him the focus of your prayers, not the approval of others.
- | Stay fascinated by the simplicity of prayer, knowing that it connects you to the Creator who loves and values you.

The Lord's Prayer

The Lord's Prayer in Matthew 6:9-13 is beautiful and simple. It's so well-known that we can lose perspective on what we are praying for if we're not careful. There can be a curse to having knowledge and familiarity with something. We can become blind to it over time and forget its power. We don't want just to say The Lord's Prayer; we want to live it. Let's go through the Lord's Prayer line by line and dig deeper into why Jesus gave us this example.

OUR FATHER IN HEAVEN

Jesus gives you permission to speak to God, the Creator of everything, as your Father. The disciples would have found addressing God as Dad alarming because, in the Old Testament, God was Elohim (The Strong One), El Shaddai (The Mighty One), or Yahweh (I am that I am.) They revered God's name so highly that they would remove the vowels when they wrote His name so that it wouldn't become common and familiar. The titles make it feel like there is distance, but Daddy is close and intimate. John 1:12 says that Jesus

opened the door for you to be adopted as children of God. Because Jesus became what you are, you can now become what He is: a child of God. He's your only way into the family. Except for one time (Matthew 27:46), Jesus always referred to God as His Father. Your prayer life should be a picture of a child running into their Dad's arms. Your Father in Heaven speaks of intimacy and majesty. He is where you are, with you, but He is also where you aren't, in Heaven.

It's also important to note that Jesus said to pray, "Our Father." Your relationship with Him brings you into a relationship with each other. We are family. If He is your Dad, He's also our Dad. We're better, stronger, and more stunning together as His children.

HALLOWED BE YOUR NAME

Celebration is remembering that His name is above all names. It is holy. When you celebrate His name, it's a reminder to look inward and see if you are honoring your Father in Heaven with your life. How is your life reflecting the love of your Lord? He is holy, holy, holy.

YOUR KINGDOM COME, YOUR WILL BE DONE, ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN

Anticipation builds in your heart when you pray for His Kingdom to come. It's a prayer for the return of Christ, for the resurrection, and for no more pain or sorrow. To the degree you look forward to it, you will find traction, momentum, and fuel to do His will here below. Thinking of the above gives you strength for the below. This Kingdom is within you, so this is an evangelistic

prayer. May His Kingdom come into people's lives through your actions and words. God knows the end from the beginning, so He knows what is best, and therefore you want what He wants. You can choose to see this prayer answered by the way you live. His will is in your heart.

GIVE US THIS DAY OUR DAILY BREAD

The Lord's prayer begins and ends with praise, but in the middle, you find petitions. When you pray, "Give us this day our daily bread," you're acknowledging that provision is a process.

Bread is both basic and complex. In Jesus' time, it was a staple food, but producing it involved farming, baking, and delivering—each step an opportunity to glorify God. Bread symbolizes provision and currency, reminding you that God is your source for everything in life. Bread rises, symbolizing God's work in you. Bread also requires effort; provision often involves labor. Yet there's a cycle: you expend energy to make bread, and bread replenishes your strength. Spiritually, it reminds you to nourish yourself daily with God's Word.

God calls you to ask for bread. Matthew 7:7 teaches you to ask, seek, and knock persistently, trusting Him to provide. But bread doesn't last forever—it must be used and renewed daily. Just like bread, your spiritual life thrives on a fresh connection to God through His Word.

In all this, God knows exactly what you need and provides it daily. When you pray for "your daily bread," you commit to receiving from God's abundance and to sharing it with others.

AND FORGIVE US OUR DEBTS, AS WE FORGIVE OUR DEBTORS

Bible translations differ in using the words debts, transgressions, and trespasses, but the point is that they are all describing sin. The most culturally applicable is trespasses. It's the willing disobedience of doing what you want to do simply because you want to do it. Debt is the fine that is incurred because of trespassing. The fine for sin is death, so you need forgiveness. Jesus makes a way for you to ask for forgiveness.

You need forgiveness judicially and relationally. This explains why Jesus tells you to pray this daily. You've already been forgiven, judicially, of every sin - past, present, and future. You are justified and declared righteous in Christ just as if you never sinned. This forgiveness is once and for all. Yet, you also need relationship forgiveness, which is ongoing and continual. It restores harmony in the relationship. Everything is in the light before Him. Whatever you keep concealed can't be healed. Confess and ask for forgiveness. If you don't know where you've missed the mark, ask Him, and don't fight against what He reveals. You can't be cleansed from what you refuse to part with.

When a forgiving spirit is in you, enemies lose their power over you. It feels like defeat to take a stance of forgiveness against those who hurt you because holding a grudge feels like a way to win. Yet, if you're constantly thinking about it, then it still has control over you. There may not be reconciliation or restoration, but you can move forward without resentment.

AND DO NOT LEAD US INTO TEMPTATION, BUT DELIVER US FROM THE EVIL ONE

No one is above falling into temptation. The seed of every sin lies in every heart. Therefore, you need to know how to pray for spiritual protection over yourself. He doesn't lead you into temptation; He leads you in paths of righteousness. Sin leads to death, and Jesus leads to life.

When you are on the path of righteousness where God is leading you, there will be tempting situations and moments that will present the opportunity to take a path to sin; you will then have the choice to continue to follow your Shepherd or take the detour. J.I. Packer said that if you are not conscious of your temptation, you should pray, "Lead me not into temptation," but if you are conscious of it, you should pray, "Deliver me from evil."

You don't just have an enemy who wants to take you down; you have an enemy who is determined to kill, steal, and destroy you and your calling. It is dangerous ground to stand on when you believe the lie that you don't have an enemy of your soul. You need protection because your soul is vulnerable. But your mighty God who saves you is your strength and your shield and your protection. It's not on you to protect yourself, but it is on you to walk with Him, abide in Him, and stay in His leading. You have the Deliverer right there with you, so let Him lead you, and when you're close to Him, it will be easier to hear His voice and obey Him.

FOR YOURS IS THE KINGDOM AND THE POWER AND THE GLORY FOREVER. AMEN.

The Lord's Prayer ends with a declaration of praise that transcends time and space: "For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen." This is not just a formality or a routine conclusion; it is an eruption of worship. It's a doxology—a statement of praise that lifts your heart above your present circumstances and anchors you in the eternal.

The tradition of ending prayers with doxology dates back to the days of King David, who declared in 1 Chronicles 29:11, "Yours, O Lord, is the greatness, the power, and the glory, the victory and the majesty; for all that is in heaven and earth is Yours." Jesus' disciples carried this tradition forward, and through the power of the Holy Spirit, these words have become a lasting anthem for the church.

Why end with praise? Because worship shifts perspective. It acknowledges that God already knows it all. When you praise, you are reminded that it's not about your kingdom, power, or glory—it's about His. Praise lifts your eyes, giving you a heavenly vantage point that makes your earthly worries seem smaller in comparison.

Living with this perspective changes everything. You can trust that the trials you face are momentary and produce far greater glory (2 Corinthians 4:17). You can stand tall, knowing that you are part of an unshakable Kingdom. You can face the future with confidence because you know how the story ends—God is on His throne.

Types of Prayer

Prayer is a dynamic and multifaceted conversation with God, encompassing various expressions that meet the deepest needs of our hearts and draw us closer to Him. From praising His greatness to seeking His help, prayer shapes and strengthens our relationship with the Father. Each type of prayer serves a unique purpose, inviting us to adore His holiness, confess our sins, give thanks for His goodness, and present our requests with both trust and boldness.

ADORATION:

Adoration is a type of prayer that focuses on praising and worshiping God for who He is rather than for what He has done. It is an expression of love, reverence, and awe for God's nature, holiness, and greatness. In adoration, you acknowledge God's majesty, power, beauty, and worthiness to be honored above all else. Adoration helps us align our hearts with God's greatness, fostering a spirit of humility, worship, and intimacy in our relationships with Him.

| *“Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory!” Isaiah 6:3*



CONFESSION:

Daily confession is vital in your walk with Jesus. God desires an intimate relationship with His children. Sin causes separation and breaks intimacy with your Creator. Hidden sins can even have physical consequences that take a toll on your mind and body. Consistent confessional prayer sets you free from sin, bringing healing and wholeness. Humble honesty with your Father about your sins, struggles, thoughts, and actions allows you to take hold of the freedom offered by Jesus' sacrifice on the cross while drawing you closer to a relationship with your loving Father.

| *“If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.” 1 John 1:8-9*

THANKSGIVING:

When you approach the throne with gratitude and praise, you are giving God the glory He deserves. It is His divine power that has given you all things that pertain to life. Thanksgiving right-sizes you in creation, keeping your pride at bay and your heart humble. Your genuine prayer of gratitude is a multiplier. You praise Him and bless His name; in return, He fills you with peace. His mercy causes you to overflow with thanksgiving, bringing Him glory, and on goes the cycle that we'll never understand. What a privilege it is to worship the Creator of the universe and to be His people.

| *“Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, And into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name.” Psalms 100:4*

SUPPLICATION:

The Greek word for supplication is *deésis*, “to plead humbly,” which implies a felt need that is personal and urgent and is used to describe an earnest request for help from God. Scripture implores you to take all your needs to God. As an adopted child of the King, you are to approach your Father with humility, trusting He is your ever-present help in times of trouble; with boldness, knowing He is your loving Father who will hear your cry for help; and with confident faith, believing that He will respond with grace and mercy.

| *“Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.” Hebrews 4:16*

INTERCESSION:

The invitation to intercession is one of your greatest privileges as a believer. You are given the honor of bringing another before the throne and praying on their behalf for salvation, protection, provision, and healing. With the wisdom of the Holy Spirit, you are charged to keep watch and bring anything that is out of alignment before your merciful God. Seeking the Lord’s will, you pray His best for leaders, pastors, government officials, and even those who persecute you. You pray for blessing over your city, country, and world. As you do, you trust that your Father is taking care of all your personal cares and needs, freeing you to focus on others.

| *“Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence.” 1 Timothy 2:1-2*

FASTING:

The Lord has everything you need, whether it be provision, protection, sustenance, or healing. There is nothing in all of creation that is out of Yahweh's control. He is holy, all-powerful, and an all-consuming fire. Yet, your Father invites you to approach Him with all your needs. But reverence and awe is needed in order to do so. By fasting, you bring your physical body into submission along with your soul as you approach the throne of God. When you submit yourself to Him, He will be attentive to your cry. There are some things He will do only when you choose to willingly submit your entire self unto Him.

| *“So He said to them, “This kind can come out by nothing but prayer and fasting.” Mark 9:29*

LAMENT:

Jesus Himself declared, “In this world you will have trouble,” but then went on to encourage you that “He has overcome the world”! The Lord does not shy away from the fact that life can be really painful. He doesn't call you to live a “too blessed to be stressed” life all the time, denying your heartache. Instead, He invites you to bring it all to Him, to welcome Him into your deepest hurts, and to trust Him with your grief. You can approach the throne boldly, express your emotions, and bring Him your questions. Whatever it is, He can handle it. Keep running to Him, keep crying out to Him, keep asking Him to see His perspective in your life. And He will overwhelm you with His peace.

| *“These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.” John 16:33*

MEDITATION/IMAGINATION:

All throughout Scripture, there are examples of God speaking to His people through dreams and visions. When these are properly deciphered, they serve to reveal the truth, warn against sin or coming harm, or give a glimpse into the greater story that He is weaving. The world is loud and distracting, making it hard to hear what Scripture describes as the quiet voice of the Holy Spirit. It says in Scripture that Jesus often withdrew to quiet places so that He could engage with His Father in prayer. You are encouraged to do the same. As you meditate on the Word and invite the Lord into your mind, He often will speak to you using the wonderful, imaginative qualities He so intentionally designed in you.

| *“So He Himself often withdrew into the wilderness and prayed..” Luke 5:16*

Postures of Prayer

When it comes to prayer, posture isn't everything—but it's definitely something. Just like in a conversation, our body language can say a lot about what's going on in our hearts. Tone communicates everything. Saying 'thanks a lot' could be done in an insincere way, or it could actually come from a place of gratitude. Studies show that only 7% of communication comes from the words themselves, while over 55% is nonverbal— body language and posture. So when we approach God in prayer, how we position ourselves physically can speak louder than we realize.

HANDS RAISED:

Raising your hands in prayer is a powerful act of both celebration and surrender. It's a visible expression that says, "God, I trust You, and I'm here for whatever You have for me." When you lift your hands with palms open toward heaven, you're celebrating the truth of the gospel while humbling yourself before the One who holds everything. In essence, it's saying, "Your will be done," as you submit to His control. Psalm 25:1 says, "To You, O



Lord, I lift up my soul,” and in raising your hands, you’re lifting your heart and life to the Creator.

Your hands are more than just tools—they carry the weight of your daily actions, from work to relationships. By raising them in prayer, you’re offering everything you are, everything you do, and everything God has called you to be into that moment of worship. It’s a reminder of who you belong to and who’s in charge as you surrender all to Him.

| *“Then Solomon stood before the altar of the Lord in the presence of all the assembly of Israel, and spread out his hands toward heaven; and he said: “Lord God of Israel, there is no God in heaven above or on earth below like You, who keep Your covenant and mercy with Your servants who walk before You with all their hearts.” 1 Kings 8:22-23*

| *“Hear the voice of my supplications when I cry to You, When I lift up my hands toward Your holy sanctuary.” Psalms 28:2*

| *“Let my prayer be set before You as incense, The lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.” Psalms 141:2*

KNEELING:

Kneeling in prayer is a posture of deep humility and reverence before God. It signifies surrender, dependence, and submission to His will. When you kneel, you physically lower yourself, acknowledging that God is greater and you need His strength, grace, and guidance. It’s an act that reflects the heart’s attitude of being yielded to the Father, saying, “Not my will, but Yours be done.” Kneeling can also represent earnest devotion and a cry for mercy as you bring your needs, struggles,

and praises before the throne of grace.

- | *“That at the name of Jesus, every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth,” Philipians 2:10*
- | *“For this reason I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.” Ephesians 3:14*

SILENT:

Silence in prayer is a posture of stillness and attentiveness, making space to hear from God. It reflects a quiet trust and reverence, where words are set aside to allow the Spirit to speak and minister to your heart. In moments of silence, you acknowledge that God’s voice is more important than your own, creating room for Him to lead, comfort, and reveal Himself. Silence also speaks of surrender, as it expresses a calm confidence that God is in control, even when you don’t have the answers or know what to pray.

- | *“Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!” Psalms 46:10*
- | *“And after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a still small voice.” 1 Kings 19:12*

LYING/BOWING LOW:

Over and over in the Bible, you read about people praying while lying prostrate or bowing before the Lord. To prostrate is to lie face down, flat on the ground, or to bow low and touch one’s face to the ground. They are sometimes one and the same, or they blend. It is simply an outward expression of a surrendered heart, acknowledging

your full dependence on, submission to, and holy fear of the Lord. Jesus Himself “fell with His face to the ground and prayed” (Matthew 26:39). God lovingly designed every cell in your body and knows every single hair on your head. By physically bowing or prostrating yourself before Him, you humbly offer your body back to Him, whether overwhelmed by trouble or in awe of His glory and majesty—a living, breathing sacrifice.

| *“So Moses made haste and bowed his head toward the earth, and worshiped.” Exodus 34:8*

Praying the Promises of Scripture

God's Word is filled with promises that reveal His character, His love, and His faithfulness. When we pray His promises, we align our hearts with His truth, allowing His Word to guide and shape our prayers. This practice not only deepens our faith but also reminds us of the unchanging nature of God and His commitment to us in every season of life. We can use these as a foundation for prayer, or we can simply pray the words as they are—the most powerful words inspired by the Holy Spirit.

SALVATION:

| *“For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.” Ephesians 2:8-10*

| *“For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.” Romans 8:38-39*

GOD'S PRESENCE:

| *“Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee*

from Your presence? If I ascend into heaven, You are there; If I make my bed in hell, behold, You are there. If I take the wings of the morning, And dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, Even there Your hand shall lead me, And Your right hand shall hold me.” Psalms 139:7-10

You want me to run to You with everything, and I thank You for being my faithful Father. Thank You for the Comforter, the Holy Spirit You have sent to help me. I humble myself before You and seek You. I feel like I'm double-minded; I try to carry the responsibility for things You never intended me to hold. I surrender my worries, my fears, my bitterness, and my anxiety to You. Help me to understand the root of my anxiety, to discern facts from assumptions, and what I have the right or ability to control. Reveal the areas in my life that I'm trying to live

in my own strength. Guard my heart with Your peace. Keep me from the evil one. Help me to fix my thoughts on Your Truth and think on what is honorable, pure, right, lovely, and admirable. In Jesus' name, Amen.

WAITING:

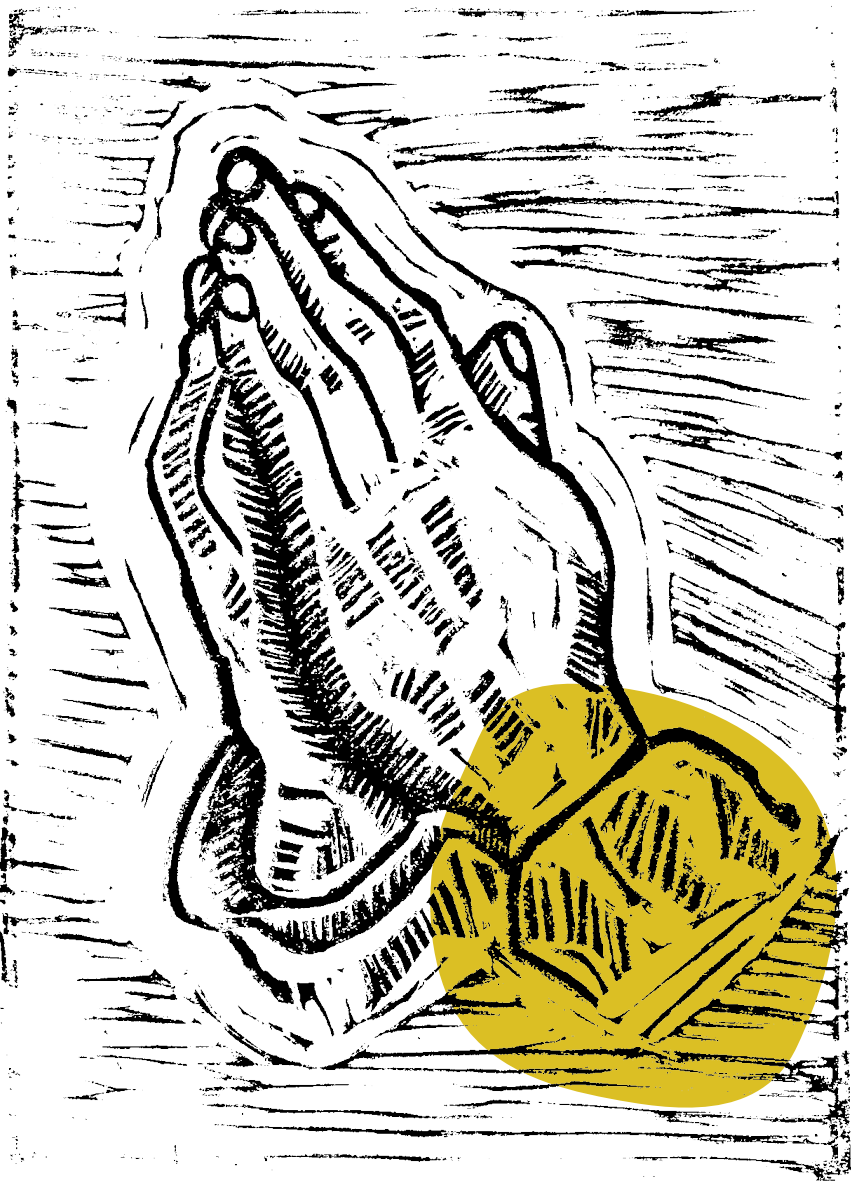
